(2) Financial aid programs

1 Financial aid program

Eligible to apply: Elementary school and junior high-school students

Izumisano city helps cover part of the school expenses, such as for supplies, lunches, trips, uniforms, etc. for children so they can complete their compulsory education and avoid any problems attending school due to financial hardships.

② High school tuition support fund (operated by the government)

Eligible to apply: All high school students, regardless of whether they attend public or private high schools (there are some restrictions.)

The government subsidizes the tuition for high school.

An amount equivalent to the tuition for public high school (standard amount) is provided.

That means you do not cover the tuition if your child goes to a public high school.

For a student going to a private high school, etc., the government provides funds in addition to the standard amount mentioned above based on the parent's income.

3 Tuition support fund for students going to private high schools, etc. (operated by

Osaka Prefecture)

Eligible to apply: High school students residing in Osaka and going to private high schools, etc. located in Osaka and designated by Osaka Prefecture

In conjunction with the "High school tuition support fund" operated by the government, even students going to private high schools, etc. can go to school at no cost or at a substantially reduced one (there are some restrictions.)
